>> Please read these Notes before completing the form

If you were born overseas and one of your parents was a New Zealand citizen at the time of your birth, you may be eligible for New Zealand citizenship by descent. You must determine your citizenship status through the Citizenship Office before we can issue you with a New Zealand passport. Please contact the Citizenship Office (0800 22 51 51 0r +64 4 382 3518 if calling from overseas), or a New Zealand Embassy, High Commission or Consulate for more information.

Who needs to fill out this Passport application?

Fill in this form yourself if you are 16 years of age or over.

The form **must not** be filled in by your wife, husband, de facto, partner, civil union partner, parent or friend unless you are under 16 years of age or have a disability or language difficulty that prevents you filling it in yourself.

The Statutory Declaration on page 13 will need to be completed where an application has been filled in on your behalf due to a disability or language difficulty.

Who needs an application?

A **separate application** form must be completed for each adult and each child.

You will need to fill in an application if you are (a) applying for a passport for the first time, (b) you wish to replace your current passport, (c) your passport has expired, (d) your passport has been lost, stolen or damaged.

How long will it take?

The processing time only begins when we have received a correctly completed application and we have all the information we need to issue a passport. Extra time should be allowed for delivery to and from the Passport Office.

Your passport will be sent by 'signature required' courier within New Zealand. Please make sure someone is available at the delivery address stated on p5 q10 to sign for the passport. If no-one is available to sign for the passport, a calling card will be left in the letter box for re-delivery or collection to be organised.

Standard Service

The standard time to process an application is up to 10 working days.

Urgent Service

The urgent processing of an application is up to 3 working days. The fee for this service is an additional \$150 per application.

The urgent fee can be waived or reimbursed when the need to travel is due to bereavement or serious illness. Written evidence (in English) on official letterhead from a doctor, hospital or police is required to explain the circumstances. Phone us if you need further information.

Callout Service

When an application for the issue of a passport falls outside normal office hours, a Callout Service is available by appointment seven days a week. (Family call-out rate applies.) Phone us for further information.

Overseas Service

If you are overseas you can contact the nearest New Zealand Embassy, High Commission or Consulate, or post your application directly to the Passport Office in New Zealand. You should include payment for your passport to be returned by international courier. Refer to the Fees section on page 8 of this form (question 27) or contact us for more information on courier fees.

How much will it cost?

A fee is payable for the processing of each application.

If you are applying for a passport while overseas please check the correct fees with the office where your application will be processed.

How do I pay if my application is sent from overseas?

If you choose to send your application to New Zealand for processing, you will need to make your payment in New Zealand currency. The fee can either be paid by credit card (AMEX or DINERS credit cards not acceptable) or by bank draft or bank cheque made out in New Zealand dollars drawn on a New Zealand bank.

Warning

If your cheque is dishonoured by the bank, you will be liable for any costs the Department of Internal Affairs incurs in recovering that fee. Additional costs will include bank and debt collector charges.

Where fees have not been paid for an issued passport, we may amend your passport details on our computer so that it cannot be used for travel.

How long is a Passport valid for?

Your New Zealand passport will be valid for travel until the expiry date shown in the passport. This will usually be a maximum of 5 years from the date of issue. It is a requirement of some governments that a passport needs to have at least 6 months validity remaining after the date of intended departure from the country being visited.

What if my Passport or Travel Document has been lost, stolen or damaged?

If your passport or travel document has been lost or stolen **you must advise** the New Zealand Passport Office immediately (see contact details on page 1) and report to Police. If you require a replacement passport, complete this application form, including the Declaration of Loss, Theft or Damage on page 12. The Passport Office may at its discretion, issue a replacement passport for a period less than the full period of validity.

The loss or theft of a passport or travel document is a serious matter, and there may be some delay while enquiries are made before a replacement can be issued. If your Passport or Travel Document is lost or stolen outside of New Zealand, then contact your nearest New Zealand Passport Office or New Zealand Embassy, High Commission or Consulate, and report to local police.

Do I need a visa?

Some countries will require you to have an entry visa. Check with your travel agent or contact the nearest Embassy, High Commission or Consulate of the countries you are planning to visit.

Proof of Identity

Witness Information

Ask someone you know who can identify you to fill in the 'Proof of Identity' information on page 11 and certify one of your photos. This person will be called your witness and needs to meet the requirements outlined below.

We advise you and your witness to read all of this page carefully before writing anything.

Completing this section correctly will help ensure that a passport is issued without delay.

If you are filling out this passport application for yourself, or for your child, you must not write on the 'Proof of Identity' page, or write anywhere on the passport photo, not even the name.

The Proof of Identity information on page 11 must be completed in full.

Who can act as a Witness? A witness is required for new and renewal applications

A witness must not:

- Be a relative or part of the family group, of the applicant
- Be a wife, husband, de facto, partner or civil union partner of the applicant
- Live at the same address as the applicant.

A witness must:

- Have known the person applying for the passport for at least 12 months, or since birth for a child under 12 months
- Be aged 16 years or over
- Have a daytime contact telephone number and be available during normal business hours
- Be willing to provide all the information requested on the Proof of Identity page of the passport application, and either
- Be the holder of a valid New Zealand passport, or
- > Be from one of the groups listed below.

Where an applicant is unable to find a witness who is the holder of a New Zealand passport, they may choose someone from one of the following groups who has known them for at least 12 months and meets the other witness requirements.

- Lawyer Teacher Minister of Religion Police Officer
- Kaumatua
 Registered Medical Professional
- Justice of the Peace Applicant's Employer

Note: For **Urgent Applications** – Witnesses from the above group must complete *all* sections on the Proof of Identity page 11 and the back of the photo.

For **Standard Applications** – Witnesses from the above group may just give their name, work address, day phone and complete the back of the photo. The Passport Office will make up to two attempts to contact the witness for the rest of their details. If the witness can't be contacted the applicant will be asked to find another witness.

A witness will:

- Complete all of the Proof of Identity page in their OWN handwriting
- Write the full name of the person applying for the passport on the back of one of the photos, sign their own name and date the back of the same photo in their OWN handwriting

Photographs





Please provide 2 identical passport photos of yourself. Both photos must be the same in all ways – two prints from the same negative/image – taking care they are not damaged by staples, pins, paperclips, folding or ink.

The photos must be:

- Recent photos, less than six months old
- A full-front view of face, head and shoulders, looking straight at the camera with eyes open and head straight
- Without hat, head band or head covering. If you wear these for religious or medical reasons, please state the reason on the Statutory Declaration on page 13. (In all cases, facial features from bottom of chin to top of forehead and both edges of face must be clearly shown)
- Without sunglasses. Tinted prescription glasses may be worn as long as eyes are still visible. No light reflection on glasses. Thick / heavy rimmed frames must be removed
- A true image and not altered in any way
- Clear, sharp and in focus with minimum reflective light on face. No red-eye
- With a plain, light coloured background (not white or dark) and no background shadow
- Of high quality colour showing natural skin tones (black and white photos are not acceptable), with strong definition between your image and the background
- > Taken with a neutral expression with your mouth closed
- > Shown with your eyes open and clearly visible, and no hair across face or eyes
- On high quality photographic paper of high resolution, instant colour film or low gloss coated thermal papers providing the printers are high resolution printing systems.
- No ink jet printers, extremely high gloss paper or heavily backed thermal paper
- Photo size: actual 45mm height x 35mm width
- ▶ Head size: max 80% of photo (36mm) / min 70% of photo (32mm).

The witness who identifies you on page 11 must write your full name on the back of one photo, and then sign and date it.

Your photo will be rejected if it does not meet our requirements.

▶ Please note: A business that specialises in taking passport photos will usually supply one photo with a preprinted label on the back. Contact the Passport Office for further information on photographic image requirements.

Applying for a Passport for a Child

Children require their own passport to travel. An application for a passport can be made on behalf of a child who is aged under 16 years.

To apply for a passport for a child:

- Complete a separate application form for each child, and
- Fill out the whole application, including page 10 'Consent for Passport for Child Under the Age of 16'.

The consent of at least *one parent* named on the child's birth registration or of *one guardian*, as evidenced by guardianship documentation, is required. However, the Care of Children Act 2004 requires that all the guardians of a child must be consulted, where that is practicable, when making decisions about important matters affecting the child. The parent or guardian making the application for the child is responsible for consulting with the other parent or guardians of the child.

A parenting order (formerly known as custody or access orders) that gives day-to-day care or contact to one parent or guardian will not prevent the other parent or guardian from obtaining a passport for the child. A passport will be refused only if there is a court order made in New Zealand, or an overseas court

order registered in New Zealand, which has the intent or effect of preventing the issue of a passport or removal of the child from his or her country of residence.

If you are unsure about these matters, you may wish to contact a solicitor for advice.

Guardians who are not the child's parents

If consent is given by a legal guardian who is not a parent of the child, documentary proof of guardianship is required. This may be:

- a guardianship order issued by a New Zealand court;
- an additional guardian appointment form approved by a New Zealand court; or
- an original copy of a parent's will appointing the person as a testamentary guardian together with the parent's death certificate.

A parenting order is not sufficient for this purpose. A stepparent is not, in a legal sense, a child's guardian unless appointed as a guardian through a court process or under a parent's will. Please provide original documents.

Who can make Enquiries about a Child's Passport application?

We can only discuss the details of a child's application with the **consenting parent or guardian** as stated on the form, unless prior handwritten permission is provided by the consenting parent or guardian.

When must a Statutory Declaration be completed?

You will need to complete the 'Statutory Declaration' on page 13 and provide us with additional information if:

- You are wearing a hat or head covering for religious or medical reasons in your passport photo; or
- You are completing this form on behalf of a person aged 16 years or over who has a disability or language difficulty that prevents the person from completing the form for themselves; or
- Your passport has been damaged; or
- You wish to give, or are requested by the Department to provide, additional information.

Privacy Statement & Disclosure of Information PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

The information you have provided in this form, and that which is obtained from other sources (including but not limited to the Citizenship Office and the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages) is to assist in determining your identity and eligibility for a New Zealand passport, and is authorised by you, a parent or guardian, as the case may be (refer the declarations sections of this form on pages 9 and 10). Information may be obtained by means of an authorised information-matching programme (under s.78A of the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1995 or s.26A of the Citizenship Act 1977). All this relevant information is collected in accordance with the Passports Act 1992 and is collected and held by the New Zealand Passport Office, Department of Internal Affairs, 120 Victoria Street (PO Box 10-526) Wellington. Under the Privacy Act 1993 you are entitled to access and correction of any of the personal information held. You should answer all applicable questions on the form.

Failure to do so may delay the processing of your application and may mean that a passport might not be issued to you, or that an issued passport may be withdrawn.

Disclosure of Information

The Passport Act 1992 authorises the disclosure of information from the passport records, subject to an agreement in writing, to any appropriate agency, body or person for the purpose of aiding border security, facilitating the processing of passengers, verifying the identity of the holder of a travel document or determining whether a person is a New Zealand citizen. The information that may be disclosed includes the information recorded in your passport plus: • your eye colour • your height • the status of your passport and • your passport database key number and any other information relating to a passport required to achieve the purposes of the disclosure stated above.




